

School rules



We do not bully or torment.

We do not exclude anyone.

We take good care of each other.

We keep our school tidy, both inside and outside.

For you, as a pupil at Åsgård, this means that

- Nobody will bully you, either in school, or on your way to and from school.
- You will not be excluded by anyone.
- You will be respected and you will feel safe.
- Your school will be a good environment for learning.
- Your school will be clean and tidy, both outside and inside.

In return, you must

- Be kind and considerate to everyone
- Show respect towards both fellow pupils and adults.
- Tell an adult if someone is not happy, or does something stupid – This is not telling tales!
- Let others join your games – no one should feel that they are alone.
- Not play rough, so that you don't hurt yourself or others.
- Keep inside the school boundaries during break time.
- Turn up on time and keep to set appointments.
- Follow instructions given by adults.
- Follow the rules set for each year.
- Follow the rules set for use of the school grounds.
- Help to keep a tidy school; both indoors and in the playground.
- Help to take good care of all equipment, both your own and the school's.

Other rules

- Cycling to school – is allowed from Year 5 - provided you wear a cycling helmet.
- Bicycles, as well as other wheeled equipment, must be parked in allotted places, and not used during the break time, unless agreed by a teacher.
- Use of mobile telephones is not allowed during the school day, or at SFO (After School Activity Club)
- The throwing of snowballs is only allowed in set areas.
- Sweets and tuck are only allowed when agreed by members of staff.

Consequences of breaking the rules:

You will always be allowed to explain yourself before any decision is made:

- A teacher, adult or the head mistress will speak to you.
- Your parents will be told of which rules you have broken.
- You may be removed from your class or break time, and be supervised for the remainder of the lesson, break time or the rest of the day.
- A meeting will be arranged for you, with your parents and school staff.
- If you damage equipment belonging to either the school or fellow pupils, you will have to replace this.
- If you break the rules by using any equipment, despite warnings, it may be confiscated.
- If you don't complete a lesson, either by your behaviour, being disruptive or being late for class, you will have to make up lost time, either during break or after school. Your parents will be informed of this.
- You may be excluded from school for particular lessons or for the rest of the day.

Any punishment not included in the school rules, will not be used without prior agreement with the parents. These rules have been approved by each Year.

Parental Rules

- Encourage your child's loyalty to their school.
- Do tell the school at once if something has happened that needs to be sorted out.

The School Rules were formulated and approved by the Working Group for Åsgård School, in accordance with the delegated Resolution from the Adolescence and Cultural Director at Ås Borough Council on 13.06.07.

The legal basis for these rules is found in Education Law § 2-9, and §§ 9a-1, 9a-4 and 9-5.

The School Rules are a regulation according to Administration law §2.

Institutions and organisations affected by these rules may have their say before the rules are approved, changed or repealed. See Administration law §37.

These regulations have to fulfil the requirements of Administration law § 38.
